1) Depression Scales

1. The Center for Epidemiologic Studies Depression Scale (CES-D)

The Japanese version of the scale comprises 20 items with 4 options, the same as the original. This scale consists of 4 subscales as follows: somatic and retarded activity, depressed affect, positive affect, and interpersonal relations. Higher scores indicate higher depressive symptoms. A person with total score at and above 16 is supposed to have clinically significant depressive tendency.

2. Geriatric Depression Scale (GDS)

GDS is another depression scale adopted in our research. Each of 15 items has yes/no response keys. Higher score indicates higher depressive symptoms. Total score of 6 and higher means significant depressive tendency. Only participants over 60 years old performed the scale in the NILS-LSA since this scale is designed

specifically for older adults.

## 2) Subjective Well-being

### 1. Life Satisfaction Index-K (LSI-K)

The LSI-K has 9 items with 2- or 3-point response format to measure overall subjective well-being.

This scale also consists of 3 subscales include: satisfaction with life as a whole, psychological stability, and evaluation of own aging.

Response to 3-point scale is dichotomized when calculating total score, so that the possible total score range is 0 to 9. Higher score indicates higher life satisfaction.

### 1. Stress Checklist

Fifty-eight items are picked up from some traditional checklists and scales to estimate stressful life-events and daily hassles. Participants are asked to check off the items they confronted in recent past (between second and third examinations in the NILS-LSA).

### 2. The Katz Index

This scale generates the index of basic ADLs.

The index permits ranking of individuals according to adequacy of performance in six functions (bathing, dressing, going to toilet, transferring, continence, and feeding). Adequacy is expressed as a grade (A to G).

Level A means overall independence in the functions, and the opposite pole is level G, which means general dependence in ADL.

None of the participants in the third-wave sample were graded as level D to G.

7) Intelligence and Cognitive Function Scales

1. Wechsler Adult Intelligence Scale-Revised Short Forms (WAIS-R-SF)

This short form of WAIS-R provides cost-effective and useful estimates of intelligence particularly for older participants since their attention and motivation could diminish easily if testing becomes prolonged.

WAIS-R-SF has the following four subtests: information, similarities, picture completion, and digit symbol.

Estimated intelligence quotient (EIQ) is derived from all four subtests.

Intelligence level of individuals are ranked according to EIQ scores as low ( $EIQ < 80$ ), middle ( $80 \leq EIQ < 120$ ), and high ( $120 \leq EIQ$ ).
